GUIDANCE ON CONTROLLED HOUSING CONDITIONS FOR TRICHINELLA

- From 1st June 2014 all breeding sows and boars and pigs from non-controlled housing conditions must be tested for Trichinella in UK¹. This
 requirement applied from 1 November 2014
- Basic general requirements for controlled housing conditions such as pest control, feed storage remain in place (see below). The majority of these
 requirements are covered by assurance standards schemes
- Pigs that have some access to outdoor facilities could now fall under the umbrella of controlled housing conditions subject to a risk assessment carried out by producers
- At present there is no official guidance that provides a framework for the risk assessment. In the meantime FSA advises farmers to use their judgment to decide if their pigs come from controlled housing
- FSA position is that pigs that spend their entire life outside such as free range pigs are very unlikely to meet the definition of controlled housing
 conditions. They represent the greater risk of infection of Trichinella
- Once the FSA risk assessment framework and guidance are available, producers who need to revisit their assessment will receive no penalties
 against them, as long as reasonable judgement has been used to qualify 'controlled housing' in their case
